## Project Description:

SDOT is planning to construct the next segment of the Burke Gilman Trail, a multi-use pedestrian and bicycle path, from NW 60th Street to Golden Gardens Park. It will run alongside the east side of the Ballard Terminal Railroad tracks between NW 60th and approximately NW 67th Streets. From there, the trail will cross the tracks and head down to Seaview Avenue NW where it will continue north to the newly realigned intersection at the entrance to Golden Gardens Park. Improvements to drainage, landscaping, and lighting will also be completed during construction.

## Project Update:

During this past spring, SDOT and the Parks & Recreation Department completed the construction of the realignment of the intersection of Seaview Avenue NW and Seaview Place NW. SDOT has continued working on the design of the trail (we have just reached 90% design completion) tackling challenging design issues related to drainage, retaining walls, and environmental investigations.

## Upcoming Milestones:

- Design completion – December 2006
- Construction Start – Summer 2007 (assuming funding is available)
